Introductory remarks

The Government of the Democratic Republic of Congo is pleased to present a summary of the country's main development priorities for the coming years.

Its structure and content reflect the vision of His Excellency Félix-Antoine Tshisekedi Tshilombo for economic recovery, territorial cohesion, and structural transformation of the country.

This programmatic framework is divided into three major components, structured around the national priorities of modernization and inclusive growth:

Program I. interconnectivity projects

Program II. Social and Economic transformation projects

Program III. Modernization projects

Program I, relating to interconnectivity projects, focuses on consolidating the country's economic and territorial unity. It aims to rehabilitate and modernize rail, port, and road infrastructure, as well as expand telecommunications and high-speed digital connections. Through these structural investments, the Democratic Republic of Congo intends to strengthen its internal and external connectivity and assert itself as a strategic hub within regional economic corridors.

Program II, dedicated to social and economic transformation projects, embodies the national

desire for diversification and resource development. It is part of an integrated development approach for productive sectors—mining, agriculture, energy, health, education, and scientific research—in order to promote sustainable, inclusive, and resilient growth focused on the well-being of the population and the creation of decent jobs.

Program III, devoted to modernization projects, aims to reposition the Democratic Republic of Congo as a competitive economic player and strategic partner on the international stage. It emphasizes the modernization of public services through e-governance, the strengthening of basic infrastructure, and the improvement of the business climate.

These three programs, representing a total investment estimated at nearly US\$298 billion, reflect an ambitious, coherent, and forward-looking vision. They constitute the pillars of a public policy resolutely focused on modernizing the country, transforming its economy, and promoting sustainable and equitable development throughout the national territory





PROGRAM I – INTERCONNECTIVITY PROJECTS

Depending on the options, the project will either involve rehabilitating the existing line with a metric gauge (1067 mm) or rebuilding a new track.
